KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND REGULATION No. II. OF 1907.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Solomons Customs (Arms) Amendment Regulation, 1911. Short title.

2. The following proviso shall be added to section three of the Solomons (Customs) Regulation, 1907 :— Amendment of section 3 of Regulation No. II. of 1907.

“ Provided always that the master of a vessel arriving in the Protectorate which is carrying any explosives shall, on arrival, first take the vessel to the port of Tulagi in the said Protectorate and not elsewhere, and there land the explosives in the manner and subject to the conditions hereinafter prescribed for the landing of goods.” Proviso.
