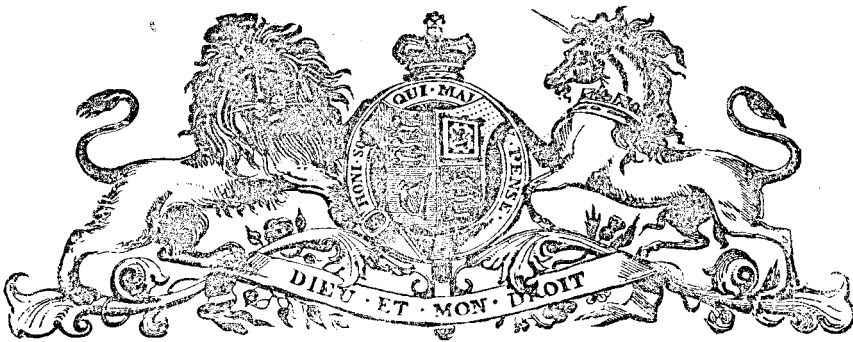

KING'S REGULATION

Made by His Majesty's High Commissioner for the Western Pacific, in accordance with the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council, 1893.)

TO REMOVE DOUBTS AS TO THE OPERATION OF
CERTAIN REGULATIONS.

1. WHEREAS it is expedient to specify the Regulations made by the High Commissioner for the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in Council 1893 that are applicable to Ocean Island otherwise Paanopa. Application of certain Regulations to Ocean Island.

2. The Regulations included in the Schedule hereto shall therefore be held as applying to the said Ocean Island otherwise Paanopa. Schedule of Regulations.

3. In all future Regulations the term "Gilbert and Ellice Islands Protectorate" shall unless it be otherwise provided be held to include the said Ocean Island otherwise Paanopa.

4. This Regulation may be cited as "The Gilbert and Ellice (Ocean Island) Regulation, 1912."
