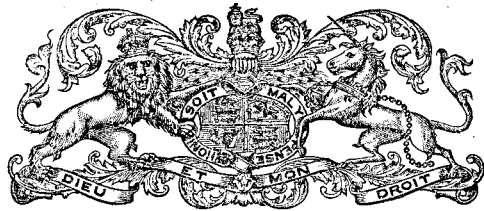

KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE LAW RELATING TO TRADING
WITH THE ENEMY AND THE EXPORT OF
PROHIBITED GOODS.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for
the Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific
Order in Council, 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the
Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great
Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions
beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith,
Emperor of India.

[7th June, 1917.]

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy and Export of Prohibited Goods Regulation 1917. SHORT TITLE.

2. If for the purpose of obtaining any licence, authority, or approval for any transaction or matter under or in connection with any Proclamation or enactment relating to trading with the enemy, or for the purpose of obtaining a licence to export any goods the exportation of which without a licence is prohibited under any Proclamation or Order in, or of, Council, any person— PENALTIES FOR FALSE STATEMENTS, ETC.

(a) makes or presents any declaration or statement or representation which is false in any material particular; or

(b) produces a guarantee certificate or undertaking which is false in any material particular, or has not been given by the person by whom it purports to have been given, or which has been in any way altered or tampered with ;

he shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding five hundred pounds, or, alternatively, in the case of goods for export, treble the value of the goods, or to imprisonment, with or without hard labour, for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment unless he proves that he had taken all reasonable steps to ascertain the truth of the statements made or contained in any document so presented or produced or to satisfy himself of the genuineness of the guarantee certificate or undertaking.
