

AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$37,547,590 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, subsidies, grants and contributions; to establish a budget for compact sections 211, 214(b), 215(a)(2), 216(a)(1), 216(a)(2), 216(a)(3), and 221(b); to establish a development budget and appropriate funds available therefor; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Definitions.

2 (1) "Budget book" means the document entitled Federated States
3 of Micronesia National Government Fiscal Year 2002 Proposed Budget
4 transmitted by the President to the Speaker of the Congress of the
5 Federated States of Micronesia on May 18, 2001.

6 (2) "Activity" means that set of activities set forth in the
7 performance budget pages of the budget book for each department, office
8 or agency. An activity is a general policy objective, the achievement
9 of which can be measured. An activity is part of a strategic goal and
10 will result in a certain amount or number of outputs or units of work.

11 (3) "Performance budget pages" means those pages in the budget
12 book that set forth the strategic goals, activities, objectives and
13 outputs for each department or agency.

14 Section 2. Operating expenses of the Executive Branch. The sum
15 of \$14,030,225 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
16 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the
2 operations of the Executive Branch of the National Government during
3 fiscal year 2002. The sum appropriated by this section shall be
4 apportioned as follows:

5 (1) Office of the President

6 \$809,876, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
7 A1.1 through A1.2 of the budget book.

8 (2) Department of Foreign Affairs

9 (a) \$3,771,123, for the activities set forth in the
10 performance budget pages A2.1 through A2.9 of the budget book.

11 (b) Conditions on use of JCN funds. Funds appropriated
12 under this subsection for Joint Committee on Compact Economic
13 Negotiations (JCN) travel (\$50,000) and representation expenses
14 (\$55,000) shall not be available for obligation or disbursement until:

15 (i) funds appropriated for such purposes under the JCN
16 budget have been exhausted;

17 (ii) JCN has provided a written report to the Committee
18 on External Affairs of the Congress of the Federated States of
19 Micronesia, through its Chairman, on the use of funds already
20 obligated or disbursed, including a description of such use and an
21 allocation among the outputs for which it was used; and

22 (iii) JCN has provided to said committee, in writing,
23 signed by the JCN chairman and members, a detailed description of the
24 planned use of the funds it is seeking to obligate or have disbursed.

25 (c) Conditions of use of Washington D.C. Embassy/JCN

1 Representation funds. \$50,000 of the funds appropriated under this
2 subsection for representation shall be for meetings between members
3 and staff of the U.S. Congress and members of FSM Congress; PROVIDED
4 however that up to \$20,000 of these funds may be reprogrammed for use
5 by JCN for representation if all section 2(2)(b) representation funds
6 have been exhausted and the requirements contained therein have been
7 met.

8 (3) Department of Finance and Administration
9 \$1,957,806, for the activities set forth in the performance budget
10 pages A3.1 through A3.8 of the budget book.

11 (4) Department of Economic Affairs
12 \$1,373,627, for the activities set forth in the performance budget
13 pages A4.1 through A4.18 of the budget book.

14 (5) Department of Transportation, Communication and
15 Infrastructure
16 \$1,500,773, for the activities set forth in the performance budget
17 pages 5.1 through 5.3 of the budget book. Of the total funds
18 appropriated under this subsection, \$25,000 for a consultant in
19 communications policy shall be deemed to come from funds available
20 under section 215(a)(2) of the Compact of Free Association for
21 telecommunications.

22 (6) Department of Health, Education and Social Affairs
23 \$980,543, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
24 A6.1 through A6.19 of the budget book.

25 (7) Department of Justice

1 \$3,078,213, for the activities set forth in the performance budget
2 pages A7.1 through A7.6 of the budget book. Of the total funds
3 appropriated, \$519,000 shall be deemed to come from funds available
4 under section 216(a)(1) of the Compact of Free Association for marine
5 surveillance.

6 (8) FSM Public Defender

7 \$558,264, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
8 A8.1 through A8.2 of the budget book.

9 Section 3. Operating expenses of the Legislative Branch. The sum
10 of \$3,098,700, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
11 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of
12 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the
13 operations of the Legislative Branch of the National Government during
14 fiscal year 2002 in order to achieve the activities set forth in the
15 performance budget pages B.1 through B.3 of the budget book.

16 Section 4. Operating expenses of the National Judiciary. The sum
17 of \$974,150, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
18 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of
19 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the
20 operations of the Judiciary Branch of the National Government during
21 fiscal year 2002 in order to achieve the activities set forth in the
22 performance budget pages C.1 through C.3 of the budget book.

23 Section 5. Operating expenses of the Public Auditor. The sum of
24 \$523,997, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
25 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the
2 operations of the Office of the FSM Public Auditor during fiscal year
3 2002 in order to achieve the activities set forth in the performance
4 budget pages D.1 through D.2 of the budget book.

5 Section 6. Operating expenses of agencies of the National
6 Government. The sum of \$1,855,677, or so much thereof as may be
7 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
8 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,
9 2002, for the operations of the following boards, commissions and
10 agencies during fiscal year 2002. The sum appropriated by this section
11 shall be apportioned as follows:

12 (1) Micronesian Fisheries Authority
13 \$460,614, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
14 E1.1 through E1.6 of the budget book.

15 (2) Board of Regents-COM-FSM
16 \$84,460, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
17 E2.1 through E2.2 of the budget book.

18 (3) FSM Coconut Development Authority
19 \$133,159 for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
20 E3.1 through E3.2 of the budget book.

21 (4) FSM Banking Board
22 \$138,712, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
23 E4.1 through E4.2 of the budget book.

24 (5) FSM Postal Services
25 \$618,732, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages

1 E5.1 through E5.3 of the budget book.

2 (6) FSM National Fisheries Corporation

3 \$375,000 for the activities set forth in the performance budget page
4 E6.1 of the budget book.

5 (7) Chuuk State Commission on Improvement Projects

6 \$45,000 for the operations of the Chuuk State Commission on Improvement
7 Projects.

8 Section 7. Special programs. The sum of \$1,604,920, or so much
9 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General
10 Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
11 September 30, 2002, for the following special programs during fiscal
12 year 2002. The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned
13 as follows:

14 (1) FSM Aquaculture Center \$129,717, for the outputs set forth
15 in the performance budget pages F1.1 through F1.2 of the budget book.

16 (2) Joint Committee on Compact Economic Negotiations (JCN)
17 \$946,769, for the activities set forth in the performance budget pages
18 F2.1 through F2.2 of the budget book. Of the amount appropriated by
19 this subsection, \$50,000 shall not be allotted until such time as a
20 contract for an eminent economist is executed, and then these funds
21 shall be used only for the purpose of paying amounts due under that
22 contract.

23 (3) National Government Early Retirement Loan Repayment Fund
24 \$282,309 for the repayment of the Asian Development Bank financed early
25 retirement loan.

1 (4) FSM National Government Employee Retirement Plan
 2 \$-0-, for the purpose of providing the initial capital for a retirement
 3 plan for the employees of the FSM National Government.

4 (5) Office of the National Election Director
 5 \$246,125, for the purpose of funding the operations of the Office of
 6 the National Election Director, including the national election offices
 7 in each of the four states.

8 Section 8. Grants, subsidies and contributions. The sum of
 9 \$2,505,791, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
 10 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of
 11 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for the
 12 following grants, subsidies and contributions during fiscal year 2002.
 13 The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

9 Section 9. Energy budget. The sum of \$308,154, or so much
10 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General
11 Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
12 September 30, 2002, to pay utility bills for National Government
13 offices, operate and maintain standby generators, and establish energy
14 conservation programs. The funds appropriated under this section shall
15 be deemed to come from funds available under section 214(b) of the
16 Compact of Free Association.

17 Section 10. Operating expenses of the Telecommunications
18 Corporation. The sum of \$832,361, or so much thereof as may be
19 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
20 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30,
21 2002, for the operations of FSM Telecommunications Corporation and
22 other telecommunications projects. The funds appropriated under this
23 section shall be deemed to come from funds available under section
24 215(a)(2) of the Compact of Free Association. The sum appropriated by
25 this section shall be apportioned as follows:

11 Section 11. Compact section 216(a)(2) programs. The sum of
12 \$116,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
13 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of
14 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for health
15 and medical referral and other Compact section 216(a)(2) programs and
16 projects. The funds appropriated under this section shall be deemed to
17 come from funds available under section 216(a)(2) of the Compact of
18 Free Association. The sum appropriated under this section shall be
19 apportioned as follows:

 2 shall be deemed to come from funds available under section 221(b) of
 3 the Compact of Free Association. The sum appropriated by this section

1 Section 13. Capital and Human Resource Development. The sum of
2 \$11,387,200, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby
3 appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of
4 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002, for capital
5 improvement, development programs and projects and human resource
6 development. Of the total funds appropriated under this section,
7 \$2,981,107 shall be deemed to come from the capital account funds
8 available under section 211 of the Compact of the Free Association, and
9 1,287,700 from the funds available under section 216(a)(3) of the
10 Compact of the Free Association. The sum appropriated under this
11 section shall be apportioned as follows:

12 (1) College of Micronesia-FSM

13 (a) Operations of the College of Micronesia-FSM,
14 including planning and construction of new facilities \$3,067,000

15 (b) Student assistance for tuition and housing to
16 be deemed as deriving from section 216(a)(3) of the Compact
17 of Free Association

18 PROVIDED that these funds shall be used strictly for direct
19 financial assistance to COM-FSM students, and PROVIDED
20 FURTHER that the co-payment by the student or the student's
21 parent must be proportionally the same for each in relation
22 to their total obligation, and PROVIDED FURTHER that only
23 students maintaining a passing grade point average will be

10 Section 15. Reprogramming. Reprogramming within a Branch,
 11 Department or Agency shall be effected by the Head of such Branch,
 12 Department or Agency by specifying the activities for which funding is
 13 either increased or decreased. The President may reprogram up to ten
 14 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each department and
 15 office in section 2 (Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch)
 16 PROVIDED that he first provide to Congress, through the Chairman of the
 17 Committee on Ways and Means, a report of the amount to be reprogrammed
 18 and the reasons.

19 Section 16. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.

20 (1) *General Provisions*.

21 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,
 22 managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with applicable
 23 law, including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of
 24 1979;

25 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for ensuring that

1 these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely
2 for the purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are
3 incurred in excess of the sum appropriated.

4 (2) *Allottees*. The allottees of the funds appropriated by this
5 act are as follows:

6 (a) section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
7 President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

8 (b) section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
9 Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia;

10 (c) section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
11 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of
12 Micronesia;

13 (d) section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
14 Public Auditor;

15 (e) section 6 through 13 - the allottee of these funds
16 shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or his
17 designee; EXCEPT THAT for the following subsections of section 6
18 through 13 of this act, the allottees shall be:

19 (i) section 8, subsection (5) - the allottee of these
20 funds shall be the Governor of the respective State, or his designee;

21 (ii) section 8, subsection (6)(a) through (6)(d) - the
22 allottee of these funds shall be the Secretary of the Department of
23 Transportation, Communications and Infrastructure;

24 (iii) section 8, subsection (8)(a) through (8)(d) - the
25 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the respective

1 State;

2 (iv) section 10, subsection (2)(b) - the allottee of
3 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
4 States of Micronesia, or his designee;

5 (v) section 10, subsection (2)(c) - the allottee of
6 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
7 Federated States of Micronesia;

8 (vi) section 13, subsection (1)(a) through (1)(f) - the
9 allottee of these funds shall be the President of the College of
10 Micronesia-FSM;

11 (vii) section 13, subsections (2)(a) through (2)(d) -
12 the allottee of these funds shall be the Governor of the respective
13 State.

14 (3) *Lapse date.* The authority of the allottees to obligate
15 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 2002.

16 Section 17. This act shall become law upon approval by the
17 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
18 law without such approval.
