### A Bill for An Act

4 To provide -

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(a) in accordance with Article VIII of the 5 Constitution, for the issue from the Marshall Islands 6 including funds provided under Fund, General 7 the Compact of Free Association and other funds, of a total 8 sum of \$34,426,324 to meet the expenditures of the 9 Government for a part of the Financial Year 2000 up to, 10 and including, March 31, 2000 (hereinafter referred to 11 as "the Interim Period") and to appropriate sums to 12 program areas; and 13

(b) for a Contingencies Fund in accordance with Section 9 of Article VIII of the Constitution; and

(c) for contingent appropriation of amounts that may be received in the future; and

(d) for delegation of expenditure approval under Section 5 of Article VIII of the Constitution;

(e) for controls on reprogramming and transfer
 of funds within appropriation areas; and

(f) for control on specific expenditures.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE NITIJELA OF THE MARSHALL

1	Section 1. Short Title. P.L. NO. 2000-1
2	This Act may be cited as the Interim
3	Appropriation (Financial Year 2000) Act 2000 and shall
4	be deemed to have come into effect on 1, October 1999.
5	Section 2. Statement of National Objective.
6	It is the objective of the Government of the
7	Republic of the Marshall Islands to hereby enact and
8	implement an interim national budget for the Financial
9	Year 2000. This will, among other things, provide
10	necessary funding for Government operations during the
11	Interim Period, pending the formulation, enactment and
12	implementation of a more comprehensive and balanced
13	national budget.
14	Section 3. Interpretation.
15	In this Act -

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(1) "program area" means program areas set out
 in Schedules 1-9 as indicated by numbering in the first
 column of those schedules;

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1	(2) "unanticipated income" means any money, not
2	being loan money, that -
3	(a) becomes available for expenditure from
4	a source at a time when the Nitijela is not meting; and
5	(b) has not been specifically included in
6	the budget estimates for the Interim Period, which the
7	Cabinet is satisfied should, in the interests of the
8	Republic of the Marshall Islands, be expended, in whole
9	or in part, before the expenditure could reasonably be
10	authorized by an Appropriation Act or a Supplementary
11	Appropriation Act.
12 13	Section 4. <u>Appropriations from the Marshall Islands</u> <u>General Fund</u> .
14	(1) Interim Total Appropriation. The sum of
15	\$19,167,723 is hereby appropriated and may be withdrawn
16	from the Marshall Islands General Fund and expended
17	during the Interim Period pursuant to Article VIII of
18	the Constitution for program areas in accordance with

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Schedule 1, Recurrent Cost, during the Financial Year
 as provided for in this Section.

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All Capital (2)Nonrecurrent/Development. 3 Funds provided under the Compact of Free Account 4 Association shall be credited to the General Fund. 5 Where the use of such Capital Account Funds represents 6 a direct charge on the General Fund such funds shall be 7 deemed to be appropriated to the Ministry of Finance or 8 to Debt Service Fund, as appropriate. 9

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#### Restrictions on Reprogramming of Compact

Funds received and appropriated pursuant to Funds. 11 Sections 111, 177, 211, 213, 214, 215, 216, 217, and 12 221 of the Compact of Free Association shall not, 13 during the Interim Period, be transferred to any other 14 activity, or reprogrammed or expended for any purpose 15 other than the permissible uses of those funds as 16 provided for in the Compact of Free Association and its 17 Subsidiary Agreements. 18

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1	(4) <u>Compact Communications Operation.</u> All	
2	moneys received under Section 215(a)(1) of the Compact	
3	of Free Association and appropriated shall not lapse at	
4	the end of the Interim Period, but shall continue until	
5	either the purpose of the appropriation is completed or	
6	funds are expended, whichever occurs first.	
7	(5) <u>Section 216 Compact Funds.</u>	
8	(a) The appropriation of \$396,700 referred to	
9	in Schedule 1 shall be credited to the Scholarship Fund	
10	established by the Scholarship Board. The Fund shall	
11	be utilized for post secondary programs as authorized	
12	by the Cabinet.	
13	(b) All monies received under Paragraphs	
14	216(a)(1), (2), and (3) of the Compact and appropriated	
15	shall not lapse at the end of the Interim Period, but	
16	shall continue until either the purpose of the	
17	appropriation is completed or funds are expended,	
18	whichever occurs first.	

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Section 5. Appropriation of U.S. Agency and Other 1 Foreign Grants. 2 (1) Subject to Sections (4) and (6), the sum of 3 \$2,703,850 (being the total amount of special U.S. 4 Agency and other foreign grants) is appropriated and 5 may be withdrawn from the Marshall Islands General Fund 6 pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution, for 7 program areas in accordance with Schedule 4, during the 8 Interim Period. 9 The amounts set out in Schedule 4 are not (2)10 available for expenditure as reprogrammed expenditure 11 Section 7 of the Constitution, under Article VIII 12 except as authorized by or under the agreements with 13 the grantor nation. 14 (3) The appropriation made by Subsection (1) 15 shall not lapse at the end of the Interim Period, but 16 shall continue until either the grant expires or the 17 funds are expended, whichever occurs first. 18 19

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Section 6. Funding of the Office of the Auditor-1 General. 2 Secretary of Finance shall withhold and The 3 deposit in a special account in the Marshall Islands 4 General Fund, one half of one percent (0.5%) of all 5 appropriated in Schedule 1 and the sum amounts SO 6 withheld and deposited may be withdrawn and expended by 7 the Auditor-General in accordance with the budget 8 approved for his office by the Cabinet, for the 9 operations and activities of his office. 10 Section 7. Contingencies Fund. 11 In accordance with Article VIII, Section 9 (1)12 the Constitution, there is hereby established a 13 of Contingencies Fund. 14 the Contingencies (2)The amount of Fund 15 prescribed, for the duration of the Interim Period, for 16 the purposes of Article VIII, Section 9(1) of the 17 Constitution is \$250,000. 18

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1	(3) Where, during the Interim Period, an amount		
2	of unanticipated income is received by the Government		
3	for the purpose of an urgent and unforeseen need, the		
4	amount prescribed in Subsection (2) for the		
5	Contingencies Fund is increased by the amount of that		
6	unanticipated income, to meet such need.		
7	Section 8. <u>Unanticipated income</u> .		
8	Where, during the Interim Period, an amount of		
9	unanticipated income is received by the Government for		
10	a specified program area, otherwise than as set out in		
11	Section 7(3), that amount is appropriated for the		
12	corresponding program area in Schedules 4 or 5, as the		
13	case may be, and the amount of the appropriation for		
14	that program area is increased accordingly.		
15 16	Section 9. <u>Notification to the Cabinet by the</u> <u>Minister</u> .		
17	When any money to which Section 7(3) or Section		
18	8 applies is received, the Minister of Finance shall		
19	notify the Cabinet of the receipt of such money, and		

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such money shall not be expended without the approval
 of the Cabinet.

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3 Section 10. Lapsing of Certain Appropriations. 4 Any increase in the amount prescribed for the 5 Contingencies Fund provided for by Section 7(3) ceases 6 and any increase in the amount of an appropriation 7 affected by Section 9 lapses -

(a) on the effective date of the next
 Appropriation Act or Supplementary Appropriation Act
 enacted after the date referred to in Subsection (1);
 or

(b) on the adoption of a Resolution to that
 effect by the Nitijela, whichever occurs first.

Section 11. <u>Delegation of Authority to Approve</u>.
 (1) For the purposes of Article VIII, Section
 5(1) of the Constitution, the authority to approve
 expenditure in a program area in accordance with
 Schedules 1-5 is hereby delegated to -

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1	(a) the member of the Cabinet primarily
2	responsible for that program area; and
3	(b) if the responsible member of the
4	Cabinet so directs by instrument in writing, and
5	subject to any limitations imposed by the instrument
6	and to general control by the member, an appropriate
7	person, authority, or agency.
8	(2) All expenditure for international travel
9	shall be approved by the Minister of Finance, or his
10	nominee. The Minister shall promulgate rules and
11	regulations in respect to all travel expenditures.
12	(3) Any expenditure otherwise than in accordance
13	with Schedules 1-5 shall require the approval of the
14	Cabinet in accordance with Article VIII, Section 5(1) of
15	the Constitution.
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1 2	Section 12. <u>Reprogramming and Transfers Between</u> <u>and Within Program Areas</u> .		
3	Before any reprogramming of expenditure between		
4	program areas is approved under Article VIII, Section		
5	7(1)(b) of the Constitution, the Cabinet shall approve		
6	such reprogramming.		
7	Section 13. <u>General.</u>		
8	In the event the actual receipts into the		
9	Marshall Islands General Fund fall short of the total		
10	amount appropriated in Schedule 6, 7 and 9, the Cabinet		
11	may reduce the amounts appropriated in Schedule 1, 4		
12	and 5.		
13	Section 14. <u>Special Revenue Fund.</u>		
14	Any moneys in excess of an appropriation made		
15	in Schedule 7 (Special Revenue Funds) may be expended		
16	during the Financial Year only in accordance with terms		
17	of the Act establishing such Special Revenue Fund.
