4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE NITIJELA OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS
5	Section 1. Short Title
6	This Act may be cited as the Election Offenses (Amendment) Act, 2003.
7	Section 2 Amendments
8	The Elections Offenses Act is hereby amended in the following manner;
9	(1) By amending section 211 to read as follows;
10	§211. Bribery
11 12	(1) For the purpose of the Elections and Referenda Act, 1980, a person or
13	candidate who, directly or indirectly;
14 15	(a) gives, lends or agrees to give, lend or offer any money or promise to
16	procure any money or other valuable consideration to or for the purposes of
17	influencing a voter to vote for, or to refrain from voting for, a certain candidate; or
18	(b). accepts or takes any money, offered or promised, in order to
19	influence the outcome of an election;
20	shall be guilty of the offense of "bribery" and upon conviction, shall be liable as follows

1	(i) in the case of a person who has been elected to
2	office, such person shall be disqualified from holding office
3	immediately and his or her election to that office shall be vacated
4	as of the date conviction, if no appeal against the conviction has
5	been filed. If an appeal has been filed, the election shall be vacated
6	on the date the appeal is denied.
7	(ii) in the case of any other person, such persons shall
8	liable to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) or a
9	term of imprisonment not exceeding one (1) year or both.
10	
11	(2) By amending section 212 to read in the following manner;
12	§212. Intimidating candidates and Voters
13	(1) A person who, directly or indirectly, physically threatens or
14	intimidates a candidate in an election so as to cause or attempt to cause him to
15	withdraw from the election shall be guilty of a felony and shall upon conviction be
16	liable to a fine not exceeding \$2,000 or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding
17	five (5) years, or both.
18	(2) A person who, directly or indirectly, physically threatens or
19	intimidates a voter in order to induce or compel such voter:
20	(i) to vote for or to refrain from voting for a particular
21	candidate in an election; or

year.	(ii). to refrain from voting in the elections or referendum; or
2	(iii) to vote or refrain from voting in a particular way in a
3	referendum;
4	shall be guilty of the offense of "Intimidating Candidates and Voters" and upon
5	conviction, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or to a
6	term of imprisonment not exceeding five (5) years or both.
7	
8	Section 3. Effective Date
9	This Acts shall take effect upon certification in accordance with Article IV Section 21 of
10	the Constitution and the Rules of Procedures of the Nitijela.
