12	(4) In addition to all criminal penalties, the Foreign Investment Business License		
13	of a person convicted of any crime under this Section shall, where applicable, be revoked by the		
14	Registrar of Corporations.		
15	(5) A person convicted of a crime under the provisions of this Act shall forfeit to		
16	the Republic any proceeds of prostitution derived by such person in connection with the unlawful		
17	act for which the conviction was made.		
18	Section 4. Prostitution houses deemed public nuisances.		
9	(1) Any room, building or other structure regularly used for prostitution activity		
20	prohibited by this Act is a public nuisance.		
21	(2) The Attorney-General may, in addition to all criminal penalties, prosecute a		
22	suit to enjoin the nuisance. If the court finds that the owner of the room, building or structure		
23	knew or had reason to believe that the premises were being used regularly for such prostitution		
24	activity, the court may order that the premises shall not be occupied or used for such period as		
25	the court may determine, not to exceed one year.
