CONSTITUTION OF NAURU

APPOINTMENT BY CABINET UNDER ARTICLE 21

IN EXERCISE of the powers in that behalf vested in it under Article 21 of the Constitution of Nauru, CABINET HEREBY APPOINTS THE HONOURABLE AUSTIN BERNICKE, being the Minister for Health and Education and a Member of the Parliament of Nauru, to perform the duties and exercise the functions of the President during the period of absence from the Republic of His Excellency President Hammer DeRoburt, O.B.E., M.P.

CONSTITUTION OF NAURU

ASSIGNMENT OF RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER ARTICLES 23

The above assignments of responsibility for the business of the Government of Nauru shall be effective during the absence from the Republic of His Excellency President Hammer DeRoburt. O.B.E., M.P.
