AN ORDINANCE

To Grant and Apply a Sum out of the Revenues of the Territory to the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, and to Appropriate the Supplies already Granted for such Year.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Terri-Preamble. tory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Appropriation short title. Ordinance, 1929-1930.
- 2. The Treasurer may issue out of the Revenues of Issue and the Territory and apply towards making good the supply application, thereby granted to His Majesty for the Service of the Year ending the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, the sum of One Hundred and Twenty-eight Thousand Six Hundred and One Pounds.

Appropriation of supplies, £153,601.

3. In addition to the sum of Twenty-five Thousand Pounds granted by the Supply Ordinance, 1929-1930, all sums granted by the last preceding section of this Ordinance out of the Revenues of the Territory towards making good the supply granted His Majesty amounting in the aggregate to the sum of One Hundred and Fifty-three Thousand Six Hundred and One Pounds are appropriated and shall be deemed to be appropriated as from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, for the purposes and services expressed in the First Schedule.

Advances for the purposes of the Second Schedule. 4. In addition to the sum specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance the Treasurer may issue and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to His Majesty for the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty, as advances for the purposes set forth in the Second Schedule to this Ordinance any sum or sums not exceeding the aggregate sum appearing in the said Second Schedule.

Passed in Council this twenty-second day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine.
