AN ORDINANCE

(Enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of Papua, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.)

To Authorise the Appropriation of a Certain Further Sum towards the Service of the Period ended on the last day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen.

WHEREAS there has been expended for the Service Preamble. of the the year from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen; to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the sum of Three Thousand One Hundred and Seven Pounds and Three Pence for certain necessary Services in excess of the sums authorised by the *Appropriation Ordinance, 1916-1917*, and the *Supplementary Appropriation Ordinances, 1916-1917, Nos. 1 and 2*, to be expended for the said Services, which additional Expenditure was not foreseen at the time of the passing of the said Ordinances: And whereas it is desirable and necessary that such Expenditure should be sanctioned by a further Appropriation: Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. The issue and application of any sum or sums not exceeding One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety-Eight Pounds, Six Shillings and Five Pence to defray Supplementary charges for the Service of the year from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the said Supplementary charges being for the Services enumerated in the First Schedule hereto, is hereby authorised and sanctioned, notwithstanding that the same took place before the passing of this Ordinance.

2. In addition to the amount specified in the First Schedule to this Ordinance, the issue and application of any sum or sums not exceeding One Thousand Three Hundred and Eight Pounds, Thirteen Shillings and Ten Pence, to defray Supplementary charges for the Service of the year from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, to the thirtieth day of June one thousand nine hundred and seventeen, the said Supplementary charges being for the Services enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto, is hereby authorised and sanctioned notwithstanding that the same took place before the passing of this Ordinance.

Officers
indemnified.

3. The Lieutenant-Governor and the Treasurer and all other Officers are hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of the issue and application of the said sums without the previous authority of an Appropriation Ordinance.

Receipts to be
full discharge.

4. The Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any Warrant of the Lieutenant-Governor in respect of any of the payments hereby authorised, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.

Short Title.

5. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Supplementary Appropriation Ordinance, 1916-1917 (No. 3.)*
