STATUTORY RULES

No. 7 of 1917.

REGULATIONS

Under the *Land Ordinance*, 1911-1916.

The Land Regulation No. 6 (Special Leases), made in Executive Council on 14th November, 1910, gazetted 23rd November, 1910, is amended by adding thereto the following new paragraphs:—

“8A. If a lease be so granted without further competition it may be granted for all or any of the purposes or for purposes other than those inserted in the *Gazette* notice.”

“9A. In addition to the improvements mentioned in paragraph 9 hereof the lessee shall, if the land is situate within a town, erect on the land within nine months from the purchase of the lease a paling fence four feet high, posts nine feet apart, or such other fence as may be approved by the Land Board, and shall keep the same erected and in good repair thereafter during the currency of the lease.”

Passed in Executive Council this twenty-eighth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seventeen.
