

STATUTORY RULES.

No. 1 of 1925.

Made under the *Places of Public Entertainment Ordinance, 1915.*

(No. 5 of 1915.)

1. The *Public Entertainment Regulations, 1923*, are amended by omitting therefrom Regulation 13 and by inserting the following regulation in lieu thereof:—

“13. (1) No person shall present or carry on or permit to be presented or carried on any cinematograph display to which a native is or is intended to be admitted unless every scene intended to be presented or produced at such display has been first screened before the Resident Magistrate of the Division in which the display is to be made or before some Assistant Resident Magistrate or European officer of Police appointed for that purpose by such Resident Magistrate.

(2) Such Resident Magistrate Assistant Resident Magistrate or European officer of Police may in his discretion issue a permit for the presentation of such display either without any restriction or condition or subject to any restriction or condition which he may think fit to impose.

(3) No person shall admit any native to or permit any native to be present at any cinematograph display for which no permit has been issued under this regulation or which is presented contrary to any restriction or condition imposed under the provisions of this regulation.”
