# PROCLAMATIONS MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 7 OF THE CEMETERIES ORDINANCE, 1911 VESTING LAND IN TRUSTEES FOR A PUBLIC CEMETERY.

### TEXT OF PROCLAMATION.

### [Proclamation dated 4th June, 1949, and published in Papua and New Guinea Govt. Gaz. of 2nd July, 1949.]

#### PROCLAMATION

By His Honour Jack Keith Murray, Administrator of the Territory of Papua-New Guinea.

J. K. MURRAY.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance (No. VII. of 1912) intituled the Cemeteries Ordinance, 1911, it is amongst other things provided that the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may from time to time appoint, and from time to time remove, any number of persons not less than three, to be trustees of any Public Cemetery and may by Proclamation and without issuing any deed of grant, vest any lands and hereditaments in such trustees for a Public Cemetery and may declare the style or title of such trustees:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of section 19 of the Ordinance Interpretation Ordinance, 1911-1940, of the Territory of Papua, it is provided that where in any Ordinance or law of the Territory there is a reference to the Lieutenant-Governor in Council that reference

shall be read as a reference to the Administrator in Council:

And whereas by section 6 of the Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance 1945 of the Territory of Papua-New Guinea it is provided that in relation to anything done or to be done after the commencement of this Ordinance the expression "Administrator in Council" in any law in force in any part of the Territory at the date of commencement of this Ordinance shall be read as a reference to the Administrator as defined in this Ordinance:

And whereas the Administrator is defined in the Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance 1945 as the Administrator appointed under the provisions of the Papua-New Guinea Provisional Administration

Act 1945:

And whereas the Cemeteries Ordinance, 1911, was a law in force in part of the Territory at the date of commencement of the said

Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance 1945:

Now therefore, I, the Administrator, in pursuance of the powers vested in me by the Cemeteries Ordinance, 1911, and all other powers me enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that all that piece or parcel of land situate near the villages of Elevala and Tanuabada, Central Division, comprised within the boundaries set forth in the Schedule hereto and which is known as the Port Moresby Public Cemetery shall be vested in the names of the undermentioned who have been duly appointed trustees:—

And I do further proclaim and declare the Proclamation<sup>(1)</sup> bearing date 21st August, 1913, published in *Gazette* No. 19 dated 3rd September, 1913, and the Proclamation<sup>(2)</sup> bearing date 3rd July, 1946, published in *Gazette* No. 23 dated 23rd July, 1946, are hereby revoked.

Given under my Hand at Port Moresby, this fourth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, and in the thirteenth year of His Majesty's reign.

### Proclamations under the Cemeteries Ordinance, 1911—cont.

### THE SCHEDULE.

#### PORT MORESBY PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Commencing at a point which bears 59 degrees 35 minutes, and distant five hundred and nineteen and four-tenth links from a point which bears 339 degrees 40 minutes, and distant eight thousand five hundred and forty-five links from north-western corner of Section III., Town of Granville East, and bounded thence on the south-east by a line bearing 59 degrees 35 minutes for six hundred links; thence on the north-east by a line bearing 329 degrees 35 minutes for one hundred and eighty-five links; thence on the north-west by a line bearing 239 degrees 35 minutes for six hundred links, and thence bounded on the south-west by a line bearing 149 degrees 35 minutes for one hundred and eighty-five links to the point of commencement. All bearings true. Nativa Cemetery not included in the above.
