Land Ordinance 1922-1950 of the Territory of New Guinea.

NOTICE OF RESUMPTION OF LAND.

WHEREAS by section 69 of the *Land Ordinance 1922-1950* of the Territory of New Guinea, it is amongst other things provided that the Administrator may by notice in the *Gazette* resume land for any of the purposes specified in that section:

PART C: LAND—

And whereas by section 70 of the said Ordinance it is provided that no resumption under section 69 of the said Ordinance shall be made until the expiration of one month after notice in the *Gazette* of the intention to resume:

And whereas notice of intention to resume the land described in the Schedule hereto was published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-first day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one:

Now therefore, I, Frederick Beaumont Phillips, a Deputy of the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Ordinance and all other powers me enabling, hereby resume the said land for the public purpose of an Aerodrome, a public purpose which I deem necessary.

THE SCHEDULE.

All those pieces of land situated on Los Negros Island in the Administrative District of Manus being firstly the whole of Portion 2A being also the whole of the land comprised in Administration Lease Volume 3 Folio 74 containing an area of 126 hectares 50 ares more or less known as Momote Plantation Extended and secondly the whole of that piece of land numbered "5" in Paragraph 1. of the Administration Lease Volume 3 Folio 41 containing 150 hectares more or less known as Momote.

Land Ordinance 1922-1950 of the Territory of New Guinea.

NOTICE OF RESUMPTION OF LAND.

WHEREAS by section 69 of the *Land Ordinance 1922-1950* of the Territory of New Guinea it is amongst other things provided that the Administrator may by notice in the *Gazette* resume land for any of the purposes specified in that section:

And whereas by section 70 of the said Ordinance it is provided that no resumption under section 69 of the said Ordinance shall be made until the expiration of one month after notice in the *Gazette* of the intention to resume:

And whereas notice of the intention to resume the land described in the Schedule hereto was published in the *Gazette* on the twenty-sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

Now therefore, I, Jack Keith Murray, Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Ordinance and all other powers me enabling, hereby resume the said land for Commonwealth Defence purposes, a public purpose which I deem to be necessary.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. All that piece of land known as Kitschapon situated on the northern arm of Los Negros Island in the Admiralty Group in the Administrative District of Manus containing by admeasurement 234 hectares 10 ares more or less commencing at a point on the shore of Sea Eagle Harbour at high-water mark distant 1,693 and 70/100 metres on a bearing of 312 degrees 11 minutes 30 seconds from the westernmost point of the property Mokaranga and bounded thence on the south-west by the said shore at high-water mark north-westerly for approximately 3,750 metres thence on the north-west by the seashore at high-water mark north-easterly for approximately 670 metres to the northernmost point of the said island thence on the north-east by the seashore at high-water mark south-easterly for approximately 3,780 metres and thence on the south-east by straight lines bearing 201 degrees 9 minutes for 132 and 80/100 metres 206 degrees 26 minutes for 146 and 10/100 metres 201 degrees 6 minutes for 253 and 35/100 metres 206 degrees 35 minutes for 176 and 25/100 metres and 209 degrees 17 minutes for 139 metres to the point of commencement be the said several dimensions all a little more or less, and being the whole of the land described in Certificate of Title Volume 1 Folio 99.

2. All that piece of land being an island known as Koruniat (or Herringan or Kohlenat) Island situated to the north-east of Manus Island in the Admiralty Islands in the Administrative District of Manus containing by admeasurement 81 hectares 50 ares more or less situated in approximately latitude 1 degree 58 minutes 15 seconds south and longitude 147 degrees 22 minutes east between the islands Ndrilo and Los Negros and being bounded on the south by Sea Eagle Harbour and on the north by the Pacific Ocean, and being the whole of the land described in Certificate of Title Volume 2 Folio 20.

3. All that piece of land being an island known as Ndrilo (or Bile) Island situated to the north of Manus Island in the Admiralty Islands in the Administrative District of Manus containing by admeasurement 132 hectares 50 ares more or less being the whole of Ndrilo Island aforesaid above high-water mark situated approximately between parallels of latitude 1 degree 57 minutes 30 seconds south and 1 degree 58 minutes 15 seconds south and between meridians of longitude 147 degrees 20 minutes east and 147 degrees 21 minutes 30 seconds east between the islands Hauwei and Koruniat and being bounded on the south by Sea Eagle Harbour and on the north by the Pacific Ocean, and being the whole of the land described in Certificate of Title Volume 2 Folio 19.

4. All that piece of land being an island known as Hauwei Island to the north of Manus Island in the Admiralty Islands in the Administrative District of Manus containing by admeasurement 33 hectares more or less being the whole of Hauwei Island aforesaid above high-water mark situated in approximately latitude 1 degree 57 minutes 30 seconds south and longitude 147 degrees 18 minutes east between the islands Pityilu and Ndrilo and being bounded on the south by Sea Eagle Harbour and on the north by the Pacific Ocean, and being the whole of the land described in Certificate of Title Volume 2 Folio 21.
