

# POSTAL (AIR MAIL) REGULATIONS.<sup>(1)</sup>

## Regulations 1939, No. 14.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Postal (Air Mail) Regulations*.<sup>(1)</sup> Short title.

2. Notwithstanding any regulations in force in the Territory under or by virtue of the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance*, 1912-1916, of the Territory of Papua in its application to the Territory of New Guinea as amended by the *Post and Telegraph Ordinance* 1923-1933, all postal articles for conveyance by air mail, containing anything whatsoever other than paper upon which something is written, typewritten, or printed, shall be delivered to a post office in unsealed covers capable of being opened in such a manner that the whole of the contents may be inspected and conveniently replaced in the cover without damaging the cover. Postal articles for transmission by air mail.

3. An officer may open and inspect any postal article for conveyance by air mail if he has reasonable grounds for suspecting that the provisions of the last preceding regulation have not been complied with. Power to open and inspect postal articles.

4. An officer may, in the presence and at the request of the sender of a postal article for conveyance by air mail, examine the contents of the postal article and, after such examination, securely seal or fasten the cover of the postal article and make a note on the postal article that its contents have been examined by him. Examination of contents of postal articles &c.
