

POST AND TELEGRAPH—

TELEPHONE CHARGES REGULATIONS 1934.⁽¹⁾

Short title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Telephone Charges Regulations 1934*.⁽¹⁾

Telephone charges.

2.—(1.) The following charges shall be payable to the Treasurer at Rabaul in respect of the telephone services specified in this sub-regulation, that is to say:—

- (a) For each line (with telephone), other than a party line, connected with the exchange—a rental of £15 per annum;
- (b) For each party line (with telephone) connected with the exchange—a rental of £12 10s. per annum; and
- (c) For each extension line (with telephone), exclusive of the line connected with the exchange—
 - (i) installed in a private residence—a rental of £2 10s. per annum; or
 - (ii) installed in a place other than a private residence—a rental of £7 10s. per annum.

(2.) Paragraphs (b) and (c) of the last preceding sub-regulation shall be deemed to have come into force and shall come into force respectively on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four and the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.
