1. In this Schedule, words and expressions which are also used in the Act have the same meaning that they have in the Act.

2. Any application by the Enterprise for approval of, or a determination by the Minister for Labour, Commerce and Industry (the Minister) required by or to be given in accordance with any of these terms and conditions shall be made in writing to NIDA.

3. The Enterprise will keep all its books of account and records in Papua New Guinea and in the English language.

4. The Enterprise will comply with all and any obligations and conditions relating to the employment of non-citizens, the training of employees and the localisation of its staff (including both employees and officers of the Enterprise) which may be laid down by the Department of Labour, Commerce and Industry (or any other Department which succeeds to the functions of that Department) or prescribed or declared under the *Employment (Training and Regulation) Act 1971* or under any other Act dealing with employment of non-citizens, training and localisation of employees.

5. Subject to the Act and to these conditions, this registration is for five years from the date of registration, but may be extended from time to time by the Minister on the application of the Enterprise.

6. Within the range of outboard motors and the range of motor cycles from time to time notified in the *National Gazette* as bearing a reduced rate of duty pursuant to the Customs Tariff 1959 as amended (The Rationalised Range), the Enterprise may wholesale and retail only such makes and models as are approved from time to time by the Minister for Transport and Works by notice in writing to the Enterprise.

7. (i) The Minister for Transport and Works may, by subsequent notice in writing, properly given in accordance with Condition 7(ii), modify, vary, suspend, revoke or impose conditions upon any approval given pursuant to Condition 6, and the Enterprise shall forthwith comply with such subsequent notice.

(ii) Subsequent notice shall be properly given if—

(a) at least thirty days prior written notice is given to the Enterprise of the Minister for Transport and Works intention to modify, vary, suspend, revoke or impose conditions upon any approval by subsequent notice; and

(b) the Enterprise is given reasonable opportunity during such period to consult with the Minister for Transport and Works or his Department concerning the terms of the subsequent notice.

8. The Enterprise shall not during the period referred to in Condition 7(ii) take any action calculated to avoid or defeat any proposed modification, variation, suspension, revocation or condition of which notice has been given.

9. Within six months of the date of registration, the Enterprise shall, after discussion with the Secretary of the Department of Transport, Works and Supply or his delegate, submit to the Secretary acceptable Schedules relating to holdings of stocks of spare parts and acceptable programmes for the provision and training of service staff, the provision of service facilities and the instruction of owners in the use and maintenance of their outboard motors and motor cycles.

10. The Enterprise shall at all times comply with Schedules and programmes submitted and accepted pursuant to Condition 9.

11. The Enterprise shall, before each anniversary of the date of registration discuss with the Secretary of the Department of Transport, Works and Supply or his delegate, the possibility of establishing retail outlets for the Enterprise's outboard motors and motor cycles in provinces not already having such retail outlets.

12. (i) The Enterprise shall obtain the approval of the Minister before wholesaling, retailing or repairing outboard motors and parts from a place of business in any location in Papua New Guinea other than Port Moresby, Lae, Rabaul, Kieta, Madang, Wewak and Mt Hagen.

(ii) The Enterprise shall obtain the approval of the Minister before wholesaling, retailing or repairing motor cycles and parts from a place of business in any location in Papua New Guinea other than Port Moresby, Lae, Rabaul, Kieta, Madang, Wewak and Mt Hagen.

13. If at the expiration of nine months from the date of registration the Enterprise is not carrying on business in any activity at a location for which it is hereby registered, the registration of the Enterprise shall thereupon cease and determine in respect of that activity at that location.

14. The Enterprise will as far as practicable appoint Papua New Guinean enterprises as its agents and will guide and assist such enterprises in running their agencies.

15. The Enterprise shall not without the prior approval in writing of the Minister:

(i) require as a condition of the supply of goods or services to another enterprise, that that enterprise acquire all or part of its requirements of goods or services of another class directly or indirectly from a second enterprise;

(ii) induce another enterprise to refuse to deal with a second enterprise except on terms disadvantageous to the second enterprise;

(iii) impose prices or other terms of conditions of dealing that it would be unable to impose but for its dominant position in the market of Papua New Guinea.
