CONSTITUTION

DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

I, Michael Thomas Somare, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby—

(a) revoke all previous Determinations of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers; and

(b) determine that each minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have—

(i) the title specified in Column 1; and

(ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 2; and

(iii) the responsibilities for administering the Act (or part of an Act) specified in Column 3,

and set out opposite the name of the Minister,

to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.

A Law to alter the Organic Law on Provincial Boundaries by altering the boundaries of the Eastern Highlands Province and describing the boundaries of a new province namely Kainantu, and for related purposes,

MADE by the National Parliament.

1. PROVINCES (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 1).

Section 1 of the Organic Law on Provincial Boundaries is amended by inserting after “(b) Gulf Province” the following “(ba) Kainantu Province”.

2. AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE.

The Schedule to the Principal Law is amended—

- (a) by deleting the description of the boundaries of the Eastern Highlands Province and inserting the descriptions of boundaries specified in Schedule 1 of this Law; and
- (b) by inserting after the description of boundaries of Gulf Province the name and description of boundaries specified in Schedule 2 of this Law.

- (k) thence again on the north-east by the said parallel of south latitude through Mount Otto due east to its intersection with the middle thread of the Ramu River
- (l) thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-westerly to the intersection of parallel 6 degrees 6 minutes 30 seconds south latitude with meridian 145 degrees 46 minutes 30 seconds east longitude
- (m) thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to the intersection of parallel 6 degrees 10 minutes 45 seconds south latitude with meridian 145 degrees 47 minutes 45 seconds east longitude
- (n) thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-westerly to the intersection of parallel 6 degrees 14 minutes 15 seconds south latitude with meridian 145 degrees 45 minutes 15 seconds east longitude

- (w) thence again on the south by the said parallel 6 degrees 41 minutes south latitude due west to its intersection with meridian 145 degrees 12 minutes east longitude
- (x) thence on the south-west by a straight line north-westerly to the intersection of parallel 6 degrees 34 minutes south latitude with meridian 145 degrees 6 minutes east longitude

(zb) thence again on the east by a straight line north-westerly to the intersection of parallel 6 degrees 8 minutes south latitude with meridian 145 degrees 15 minutes east longitude
