## CONSTITUTION

### CORRIGENDUM

IT is hereby notified for general information that the notice of Amendment of the Constitution regarding the law on the Integrity of Political Parties and Candidates, dated 13th May, 2014 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G185 of 13th May, 2014 contained errors, and shall be as follows:

- (a) Section 1 (Compliance with constitutional requirements) be deleted; and
- (b) in Section 7, delete Paragraphs (a) and (b) and insert and the following:

“(5) Where —

- (a) a Prime Minister has resigned and has not been nominated in the election of the next Prime Minister; or
  - (b) there is a vacancy in the office of the Prime Minister, a Member of Parliament who is a member of a registered political party, with the highest declared candidates in the election, shall be nominated for election as the next Prime Minister.
- (6) Where a candidate nominated under Subsection (5) fails to receive a simple majority of the votes in the election of the Prime Minister, the Speaker shall advise the Head of State to invite any other declared candidates in the election to form government after seven days from the date of the vote under Subsection (5)“.

*Organic Law on the Integrity of Political Parties and Candidates***CORRIGENDUM**

IT is hereby notified for general information that the notice of Amendment of the *Organic Law on the Integrity of Political Parties and Candidates*, dated 13th May, 2014 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G185 of 13th May, 2014 contained errors, and shall be as follows:

(a) that Section 63(7) should read as follows:

“(7) Where a candidate nominated under Subsection (4) fails to receive a simple majority of the votes in the election of the Prime Minister, the Speaker shall advise the Head of State to invite any other declared candidates in the election to form government after seven days from the date of the vote under Subsection (5)”; and

(b) that Section 64 should read as follows:

**“64. VOTING IN THE ELECTION OF A PRIME MINISTER FOLLOWING RESIGNATION OF A PRIME MINISTER OR IN THE EVENT OF OTHER VACANCIES IN THE OFFICE OF PRIME MINISTER.**

(1) Where —

(a) a Prime Minister has resigned and has not been nominated in the election of the next Prime Minister; or

(b) there is a vacancy in the office of the Prime Minister, a Member of Parliament who is a member of a registered political party, with the highest declared candidates in the election, shall be nominated for election as the next Prime Minister.

(2) Where a candidate nominated under Subsection (1) fails to receive a simple majority of the votes in the election of the Prime Minister, the Speaker shall advise the Head of State to invite any other declared candidates in the election to form government after seven days from the date of the vote under Subsection (1)”.
