National Procurement (Amended) Act 2021

CERTIFICATION OF CAPACITY

NATIONAL PARLIAMENT SPECIAL PROCUREMENT COMMITTEE

The Authority to Pre-Commit Committee (APCC) under Section 28 of the amended *National Procurement Act 2021* hereby certifies and endorses the committee members of the National Parliament Special Procurement Committee of the National Procurement Commission Board to procure internally up to the threshold limit of K5 million with the following conditions;

1. The National Parliament Special Procurement Committee is valid for a period of three (3) years commencing on the date affixed on this certificate and shall expire forthwith after 3 years (36 months). The renewal of this Certificate shall be done through a formal request to the APC Committee.
2. The APC Committee shall act upon the request for renewal and approval should be granted such that;
 - (a) for the last three financial years prior to the date of application for renewal, no issues have been raised in respect of any procurements undertaken by National Parliament that have not been resolved to the satisfaction of the APC Committee; and
 - (b) the names and sufficient procurement experience, training and qualifications of all of the staff of National Parliament that are to engage in procurement processes.
3. The purpose of the Committee is to:
 - Undertake, manage, control and regulate procurements within K5million.
 - Safeguard public funds and promote adherence to sound public financial management practices.
 - Ensures fairness amongst suppliers and transparency when procuring goods, services and works and;
 - Ensure procurement is conducted in a timely manner.
