A JOINT REGULATION

No. 4 of
1914.
[French
text, No.
9/1914.]

To prohibit the unauthorised erection of buildings and structures on the seashore.

[Published: W.P.H.C. Gazette No. 2 of 1915.]

1. From the date of this Regulation it shall be unlawful for any person to erect or build on the seashore of Vila Harbour between the public road or path running along such shore and low water mark any house shed wharf jetty wall or other construction without the permission in writing first obtained of the Resident Commissioners conjointly.

2. Applications for permission as aforesaid shall be addressed to the Resident Commissioners conjointly and shall give full particulars of the construction for which permission is required and the Resident Commissioners shall have power conjointly to grant or refuse such permission.

3. Such annual sum as the Resident Commissioners may determine conjointly shall be payable to the Condominium Treasury by the persons to whom the permits are issued in respect of all permits issued under this Regulation.

4. Any person who shall be proved before the Joint Court to have erected any building or construction without permission as provided in this Regulation or having obtained such permission shall erect any building or construction other than that provided for in such permission shall be liable to the payment of a money penalty not exceeding twenty pounds and not less than one pound.

5. For the purposes of this Regulation the term Vila Harbour shall mean and include that part of the sea front of Vila Harbour lying between the coffee store of the Société Française des Nouvelles-Hébrides (Pakora) on the North and the Rodin property (Nankery) on the South.
